

The end of the epidemic

Slovenia has declared the end of the epidemic as of 15 June 2021. Despite the improved epidemiological situation, however, certain measures continue to apply:

Both service providers and guests from all countries are required to comply with the **recovered-vaccinated-tested requirements**:

- inside catering establishments,
- inside tourist accommodation establishments (hotels, apartments, camps),
- at cultural events,
- at sports events,
- at public gatherings and events with more than 100 participants,
- at trade fairs,
- at conferences and congresses,
- in catering facilities offering dancing music or social events,
- in casinos and gaming halls.

The recovered-vaccinated-tested requirements do not apply to children up to 18 years of age (at cultural and sports events, children up to 15 years of age) who are accompanied by close family members or guardians.

Subject to compliance with the RVT requirement, face masks are no longer mandatory for:

- guests in indoor hospitality establishments,
- guests in accommodation establishments,
- visitors of indoor fairs,
- participants in indoor congress activity,
- visitors of casinos, gambling halls and special gambling activities,
- visitors of cultural events and
- spectators at sports events.

In any other case, the use of face masks in enclosed public spaces remains mandatory. It is necessary to ensure a social distance of 1.5 metres outdoors. If that is not possible, the use of face masks is mandatory.

100% venue capacity is allowed:

- at cultural events,
- at sports events and
- at conferences and congresses.

Entry into Slovenia without a mandatory home quarantine is permitted to persons that produce one of the following certificates:

- a negative PCR test for COVID-19 that is not older than 72 hours according to the date of the swab taken.
- a negative RAT test result not older than 48 hours from the time the swab was taken
- a certificate of recovery – a certificate of positive PCR test result that is older than 10 days and not older than six months, or medical certificate of recovery from COVID-19, if not more than six months have elapsed since the beginning of symptoms.
- certificate of recovery
- a certificate of vaccination against COVID-19, which proves that:
 - at least seven days have passed since the second dose of the Comirnaty vaccine by Biontech/Pfizer,
 - at least 14 days have passed since the second dose of the COVID-19 Vaccine by Moderna,
 - at least 21 days have passed since the first dose of the Vaxzevria (COVID-19 Vaccine) by AstraZeneca,
 - at least 14 days have passed since the first dose of the COVID-19 Vaccine Janssen by Johnson & Johnson/Janssen-Cilag,
 - at least 21 days have passed since the first dose of the Covishield vaccine by Serum Institute of India/AstraZeneca,
 - at least 14 days have passed since the second dose of the Sputnik V vaccine by Russia's Gamaleya National Centre of Epidemiology and Microbiology,
 - at least 14 days have passed since the second dose of the CoronaVac vaccine by Sinovac Biotech, or
 - at least 14 days have passed since the second dose of the COVID-19 Vaccine by Sinopharm
- an EU Digital COVID Certificate.
